

Resolution on Putin's war against Ukraine

Considering that since the unjustified attack by Putin's army on Ukraine on February 24, 2022, the siege and shelling of different Ukrainian cities and against the civilian population have not ceased, and that this is a violation of Democracy and the Human Dignity of the Ukrainian people.

Considering that the Ukrainians are on the front line, but that the fight for survival is also in favour of the Europeans themselves and the stability of democracies around the world that are threatened by Putin's desire for conquest.

Considering that the only border that Putin can respect is the one established by NATO.

Emphasizing our determination to provide Ukraine and its people with strong political, financial, economic, humanitarian and diplomatic support.

From the IDC-EDI:

- We demand an end to Putin's armed conflict against Ukraine and its civilian population.
- We encourage the international community to take a public stand against Putin's unjustified attack on Ukraine.
- We encourage the international community not to cease its arms shipment and financial support to Ukraine.
- We demand compliance with the sanctions imposed by the member states of the European Union and the United States on Russia.
- We demonstrate our support for Ukraine's accession negotiations to the European Union.
- We encourage member states with longer-range conventional military weaponry to deliver them to Ukraine in order to avoid a Russian offensive in the coming months.
