

Resolution on Vladimir Putin's dictatorship

Considering the fraudulent Presidential elections held in Russia between 15-17 March 2024, where dictator Vladimir Putin once again demonstrated to the international community that his regime has no commitment to democracy and the rule of law;

Whereas Putin imprisoned his strongest political opponents so as not to face any credible opposition candidates, thereby preventing any electoral challenge and securing a fifth term that will allow him to preside over Russia until 2030;

Considering Putin's harsh response against his opponents, which led to the assassination of Alexei Navalny on 16 February in a Russian prison in the Arctic Circle, this murder being a direct criminal violation of Human Dignity and Freedom of Expression;

Considering Putin's unjustified war on Ukraine, an unjustified aggression that has caused the death of thousands of civilians and is a threat to Europe and the democratic world;

From the IDC-CDI:

- We denounce the fraudulent and unjust elections orchestrated by Putin last March.
- We condemn the persecution, imprisonment, poisoning and murder of his opponents, in particular opposition leader Alexei Navalny.
- We demand that Democracy and the Rule of Law be guaranteed in Russia, as well as the Fundamental Rights of citizens to Human Dignity and Freedom of Expression.
- We demand an end to Russian aggression against the Ukrainian people and recognition of the Ukrainian borders that predate the also unjustifiable illegal annexation of Crimea in 2014.
