

Resolution on support for the rule of law in Ecuador

The IDC-CDI, as an international inter-party organization that defends democratic values as fundamental foundations of the rule of law in Ecuador:

Reaffirms that representative democracy is a prerequisite for the stability, peace and development of States.

Recognizes with deep concern that transnational organized crime has been intensifying the violence that threatens the security, stability and democratic governance of several States in the region and has also undermined citizen security and the institutions of the Ecuadorian State.

Taking into account, too, the links between terrorism, transnational organized crime and illicit drug trafficking.

Emphasizing the importance of international cooperation to enable States to effectively address these cross-border threats:

- 1. Reiterates that peace, citizen security and democratic stability are fundamental values for the development and prosperity of the region.
- 2. Condemn terrorism, violence and attacks by transnational organized crime against the civilian population and the institutions of the Ecuadorian State.
- 3. Express our solidarity with the Ecuadorian people and our support for the firm action of the Government of the Republic of Ecuador, led by President Daniel Noboa Azín, to confront organized crime, to preserve democratic stability, citizen security, the rule of law and protect human rights, within the framework of the norms and principles of international law.
- 4. We call on the international cooperation for States in the region to successfully confront transnational organized crime, preventing the creation of corridors for criminal activity across borders.
