

Resolution on the situation in Haiti

The IDC-CDI, as an international inter-party organization that defends democratic values as fundamental foundations of the rule of law in the Republic of Haiti, and in response to the requests of the parties of the Dominican Republic, members of the Democratic International of the Centrist, IDC-CDI.

Taking into account the accelerated process of institutional breakdown that the Republic of Haiti is suffering, where paramilitary gangs have sown terror in almost the entire territory of the capital, Port-au-Prince, attacking the defenceless population and outperforming in operational and response capacity the decimated Haitian national police, an institution that has suffered considerable casualties and desertions in recent months.

Monitoring the deterioration of the living conditions of the Haitian population, characterized by levels of extreme poverty, hunger, unsanitary conditions, lack of drinking water, absence of basic health services and shortages of medicines, a situation that keeps the people of that country in a state of prostration and despair.

Noting with concern the proliferation of numerous heavily armed gangs, which have taken control of important areas of the capital, Port-au-Prince, as well as several provinces of the Republic of Haiti, with acts of violence, terror, aggression and bloodshed,

- 1. Requests and exhorts the international community, in particular those countries with historical ties to the Republic of Haiti, to come to the aid of that country, by the most expeditious, useful and dignified means, to guarantee the restoration of order, institutions and peace in that sister nation.
- 2. Calls upon the Governments of those nations that are able and able to form part of a coalition of countries willing to make an effort to help restore order and peace in the Republic of Haiti, as well as to control the prevailing chaos and to close ranks immediately for this urgent purpose.
